# Welcome to the Webelos-Ree!

The WEBELOS-REE this fall will offer 1st and 2nd year Webelos the opportunity to participate in activities designed specifically for them in a Boy Scout camp environment. The event is organized as an optional one-night campout with a number of different instructional sessions and events planned all day Saturday. The purpose of the WEBELOS-REE is two-fold: first, it is designed to give the boys a jump start towards attaining their Webelos badges and Arrow of Light awards; and second, the event is inherently designed to inspire the boys to continue on in Scouting and eventually cross over into a Boy Scout troop.

A staff composed mostly of older Boy Scouts and experienced Scout leaders will supervise and provide the activities and skills. In this way, the Webelos are provided with a full weekend to interact and learn from the "big guys." The instructional activities will afford the boys the chance to earn several of the Webelos activity pins, to begin working towards the achievement of other activity pins, and to participate in activities that will encourage them to work on other advancements when returning home. They will also be able to participate in ceremonies, camp wide games, an evening campfire, camp cooking, and to see some of what they can look forward to as Boy Scouts.

**The Boy Scout Law and Outdoor Code will govern all participants during the course of the weekend.**

## BOY SCOUT LAW:

A Scout is Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, thrifty, Brave, Clean, and Reverent.

## OUTDOOR CODE:

As an American, I will do my best to be clean in my outdoor manners, be careful with fire, be considerate in the outdoors, and be conservation-minded.

**Notes to Leaders:**

Patrol's will be setting up camp in Kit Carson field. Above ground firepits will be allowed in the field.

Activities will be in the High Adventure area, the Outdoor Skills Shelter, and the part of the field that patrols are not using for campsites. All other places of camp are off limits during the program.

Boundaries will be outlined at the opening flag ceremony.

Webelos are encouraged to go from activity to activity as a patrol. Adults are encouraged to mingle with other adults, take a hike, read a book, or participate in training that we hope to have available.

Skits, Songs, Cheers, and walk-ons are encouraged during the Saturday night Fire Bowl. Please assist your WEBELOS with this opportunity. Please provide the Camp Director with a copy or an overview of the skit prior to the Fire Bowl.

The events will be held on Saturday with awards at evening campfire. On Sunday staff will offer an inter-faith scouts own. Your unit will have time on Sunday to do your own games, fishing and hikes if you wish before leaving.

Bring enough and the right equipment for your needs. Bring the appropriate clothing for the weather. This is fall and the weather will change. PLEASE BE SURE YOUR SCOUTS BRING APPROPRIATE SLEEPING BAGS!! The temperature can drop at night and these kids get really cold very quickly if not properly prepared and equipped. We would rather see them too warm than too cold while out camping.

The event patch will be given out Sunday when the Webelo-Ree is over. Before your den can receive them, you must do the following:

1. Turn evaluation form in to registration staff.
2. Pass the camp site inspection after your camp has been taken down.

If your unit does not stay overnight Sunday, you will receive the patch upon leaving Saturday. You will still need to turn in the evaluation form.

There will be leaders on staff who are certified in first aid and CPR.

There is no swimming or boating at this event. There will be no staff on the waterfront.

Food for the weekend should be planned by the packs. The Saturday evening meal should be planned for two or three staff members to dine with your unit. This will help meet the Outdoorsman Pin requirement for the Webelos.

Keep meals as simple and easy to clean up as possible. It may be chilly and/or wet, so we recommend warm drinks and soup be considered. Scouts love hot chocolate while at campouts, so we suggest you bring an ample supply and keep a pot of hot water in your campsite. It is easy to impress the adult staff. (Coffee is Good).

Let the boys do the cooking and cleanup. They will get more out of the weekend.

Be sure the boys have brought extra batteries for their flashlights.

**BRING YOUR DEN FLAG!**

Boys who inflict intentional personal harm on other boys or adults risk being sent home immediately. Youth staff should be respected just as adult staff should. The adult staff members stand behind and support the youth staff members.

Disruptive behavior on the parts of boys will not be tolerated. Boys will be removed from the activity and turned over to the den adult leadership.

As a matter of personal campsite courtesy, all boys and adults, before entering any activity or campsite will stop and ask the staff on site for permission to enter.

Attire for Saturday and Sunday is a "Field" or "Activity" uniform top.

Webelos who bring pocketknives to camp must have their Whittl'n chip in their possession. Spot checks will be made - you know what happens if they don't have it. Reminder, No blade on pocketknives should longer than the palm of the carrier's hand. Absolutely no sheath knives!!! Whittl'n Chips are the responsibility of the Cub Masters and Den Leaders.

### Camp Site Equipment List: (Suggested)

Tents, Ground cloths, and stakes  
First Aid Kit  
Lanterns, electric and propane, (Propane lanterns nor any type of flames are not allowed in tents.)  
Water and Sand Buckets per tent  
Rope, various lengths and sizes  
Wash station materials  
Camp stoves and fuel. (Propane if available)  
Dining Fly  
Coolers  
American Flag and Pack Flag  
Den Flag or Standard  
Dish washing basins (Suggest 3 for dunk method)  
Dish Soap and Dishrags  
Cooking utensils, pots, pans, etc. (Do not forget Potholders)  
Matches, Lighter  
Folding chairs and stools  
Hammer, etc, (Assorted tools for camping purposes)  
Clothes hangers, good for hanging Class A

### Expendable Items

Trash Bags  
Paper Towels, Paper Plates, Plastic Knives, Forks, and Spoons. (Suggested only for time saving purposes.)  
Aluminum foil  
Toilet Paper

### Personal Gear

Bottle Water  
Uniform, Class A and B, Scout T-shirt, long pants or jeans without holes.  
Clothing for season. Bring at least one extra set  
Sleeping bag. Recommend a real bag and not bags designed for the indoors.

Rain Gear or poncho  
Socks Underwear, long if appropriate etc.  
Sturdy shoes, sandals are not authorized  
Eating kit/Mess kit, with knife fork and spoon  
Personal Items, soap, toothpaste and brush, comb, and wash cloth and towel.

Flashlight and extra batteries  
Sun Screen

## Safety

Safety is everyone's responsibility. If an unsafe act is observed it is your responsibility to correct the situation. Some items to remember:

Safety with wood tools, knives axes, and bow saws.

Safety with Fire. Fires must be contained in an above ground fire pit and extinguished when the campsite is not occupied.

Propane lanterns , heaters, or flames of any type are not authorized in tents.

Burning charcoal produces carbon monoxide. Under no circumstances will-burning charcoal be used to warm tents.

Hypothermia is a true danger in winter. Keep a close look on your scouts if conditions warrant. A first aid kit must be located in a prominent place in your campsite.

If a fire is to be left burning during the night a fireguard must be awake. If not, extinguish the fire.

If gasoline-burning stoves or equipment is used, it will only be refilled away from others and only when the item has cooled.

Emergency runners will be aware of their responsibilities. Three long horn blows "meet at the camp flag pole."
